10. Village Affairs

Action: SP Highways - Toll Bar Central Reservation - Wild Flowers

Gloucestershire Highways has no objection in principle pending a formal Cultivation Licence application. Cllr Parsons agreed to consult his daughter on the best method and species to be used.

Highways – Lengthsman Works

Cllr Parsons advised that he has been allocated another week of work for his Division later in the year. It was agreed to develop a list of requirements in the Parish during the

Action:ALL next few weeks. It was noted that the surface of Cherry Tree Lane is in a particularly poor condition and needs complete resurfacing.

Cllr Parsons enquired how the new roundabout at Siddington Park Farm has affected the traffic flow and it was generally considered to have made an improvement although traffic from the Swindon direction sometimes does not slow down enough to allow traffic to continue round the roundabout.

It was noted that the roundabout at the junction with Tesco is particularly difficult to use due to the lay out and traffic volume. Cllr Parsons suggested that it if the development at Chesterton goes ahead all of the roundabouts on the ring road will need to be reviewed.

development this side of Cirencester and that this is still a good argument against this new proposal as well as the detrimental impact on the adjacent listed buildings. Cllr Parsons agreed to advise further information on which the Council could base a response.
