3.1 Acceptance and signing of the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 5 September 2019

4. Matters Arising from the Minutes

Highways Approved Schemes to Reduce Traffic Speed and Feedback from GRCC Seminar Cllr A Stone reported:

It was a very interesting meeting with some 74 attendees and good speakers including the Police, Criminal Justice system, Stroud District Road Safety Group and others.

GAPTC – Clarification on Funding for ANPR Cameras

It was noted that if a Parish Council agrees that the used of cameras would be of benefit to its area then it is possible for a Parish Council to contribute to costs incurred by the local Highways authority in providing such equipment.

5. County and District Councillors – Cllr Shaun Parsons and Cllr Mike Evemy Cllr Evemy was unable to attend but had sent an email detailing how CDC are looking to increase parking charges and Band D Equivalent CT by £5. Cllr Parsons reported:

- It is becoming increasingly difficult to find care workers and, therefore, GCC is setting up its own training scheme to increase numbers.
- More children are being taken into corporate care in Gloucestershire than before.
- A417 to be resurfaced before the end of GCC's current fiscal year.
- Siddington Road has been done recently resulting in lots of complaints from residents about the inconvenience.
- Norcote to Ampney Crucis and Ampney St Peter to the Red lion corner scheduled before the end of March 2020 giving rise to concerns from residents that Preston Village could be used as a rat run.
- The road through Kempsford has been closed at a cost of £800K due to badgers.
- There have been no major flooding problems this winter at this end of Gloucestershire including South Cerney.
- Thames Water has placed a bowser at the Norman Arch entrance to the Abbey Grounds to take out sewage.
- A417 Missing Link is likely to go forward. Highways need to buy back the PFI contract.
- Access slip roads on M5 to cope with the extra traffic.
- A419 Noise Issue Noise is measured by decibels but the frequency of the noise is

the problem with the concrete surface. Unfortunately, concrete is very hard wearing and unlikely to need re-surfacing in the near future.

However, Cllr Mrs Chester-Master had suggested the wide verge on Witpit Lane where nearby Ash trees had been affected by the disease. The Chairman and the Clerk had subsequently met with Mr Richard Gray of Gloucestershire Highways to discuss. The Chairman expressed concern that ultimately the Council would be responsible for future maintenance. Cllr Price advised that further information regarding size and variety should be sought before making a decision.
