Letter from the Vicar

As we approach the season of Christmas the Holy Land is (as I write this letter) once again in the news for all the wrong reasons. The land in which the Prince of Peace was born is a place where there seems to be no lasting peace and where violence and conflict is never far away. A couple of years ago I had the opportunity to see for myself the wall, with its military checkpoints, that surrounds Bethlehem, turning the city of David into a virtual prison for its Palestinian inhabitants. Yet once again this Christmas time our attention will be drawn to this troubled land as we remember the birth of Jesus in humble and vulnerable circumstances. Even in the time of the New Testament it was a troubled place, ruled by a cruel regime that was part of the Roman Empire. Even the family of Jesus had to flee to exile in Egypt for a while for their own safety.

Even though we often tend to think of Christmas as a time when we forget our troubles there is something very significant in thinking of Jesus being born in a part of the world where there has been so much suffering. After all, one of the themes of the season which is echoed by the carols we sing, is that Jesus was born, not into a sanitized, problem-free and sinless world, but into the world as it is, with all its imperfection and troubles. From infancy to adulthood Jesus lived a fully human life with all the joys and sorrows involved in that. He came to save us from sin and evil and to give us new life and new hope.

It is my prayer that whatever your circumstances this Christmas, you may know the presence of Jesus, the Saviour and the Prince of Peace. Why not come along to church to one of our Christmas services and listen again to this amazing story. Come and join in the traditional carols, which also help to tell the story as well as helping us to express our praise to the King and Saviour who was born in a stable for us.

My family join me in wishing all of you a happy and joyful Christmas.

NOISE FROM THE A419.417

The problem of excessive noise from the A419/417 dual carriageway is one which has been an irritant for many residents in the area since it was built in 1998. Attempts have been made over the years to lobby the Government and Highways Agency to act to reduce the noise but so far those attempts have failed. A group of residents and councillors from parishes all along the dual carriageway have now formed an action group

as we believe the promises made about noise levels and road surfaces should be kept. I am chairing the group.

We have now met twice and we comprise 16 people. We are motivated to push harder on this issue but want to understand how wide the problem is in reality.

As your parish is near or relatively near to the dual carriageway, would you mind letting me know the following please:

- Does your parish suffer from noise from the dual carriageway?
- Do residents raise the issue or have they raised it?
- Is this an issue you are concerned about as a parish?
- Would you be interested in learning more about our group and/or sending a representative from your parish to our group meetings.
