NEWS FROM ALL SAINTS CHURCH

Letter from the Vicar:

As I write, a small group of us from South Cerney (myself, plus Judith, our daughter Ruth, Raymond Fenton and Roger Edgar) have just returned from a visit to Dornakal in South India, where we have a particular link with a small community in Garidepalli, Andhra Pradesh. The community there is what is called a "Scheduled Caste Colony", and is made up of mainly agricultural labourers who earn about 12,000 rupees (about £160) per year.

We were there mainly to dedicate a children's day care centre which has been funded by the people in our group of parishes in the Churnside Benefice, and it will be known as the Churnside Day Care Centre. It was good to see how the church and centre, which also includes a very basic home for the local pastor and his family, have brought the whole community together. The centre will particularly help the children of working parents, who have no child-care provision at present.

We also were able to visit the school for deaf children in Dornakal and the Polio Home in Khammam, as well as renewing friendships with many people there. Bishop Devamani, who retires in May, sends his love to everyone in our parishes and the family are grateful for our concern and prayers for Christina, who continues to face treatment for leukaemia.

It was the beginning of summer in South India, with temperatures up into the mid 40s. We came back to heavy rain and much lower temperatures at London! Many thanks to all for your continuing interest in this Indian partnership, one of a number of valuable international links from the communities of our benefice.
