PARISH COUNCIL BUDGET

At the January meeting, the Council planned the budget for the coming year. One of the items considered was the cost of elections that CDC will be re-charging to parish councils in the future. This is the first time that Parish Councils in Cotswold District have had to budget for this additional cost.

The Council welcomed the Village Hall Committee's offer to make a contribution of £2,000 towards the Council's 2022 annual repayment of the Public Works Loan of £4,425. The loan was taken out to finance the refurbishment work on the Village Hall in 2007/8 with the final repayment being made in 2028.

NEWS FROM COTSWOLD DISTRICT COUNCIL

Cotswold District Council has agreed to implement a new season ticket offer and to increase car parking charges to help maintain car parks, invest in improvements and increase the availability of spaces.

REVIEW ON IMPROVING TRAVEL LINKS BETWEEN KEMBLE AND CIRENCESTER

Work is underway to look at improving sustainable transport links between Cirencester and Kemble after we and our partners, Gloucestershire County Council and Cirencester Community Rail Project Group have received £115,000 to study what options may be feasible.

NEWS FROM GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council budget for Highways is to have a focus on resurfacing programmes for B roads and unclassified roads. Our Councillor, Lisa Spivey, will be trying to push for some of that to be spent in the parish and surrounding area.

DEFIBRILLATOR - HOW TO USE IT

We have been asked if and how anyone (even those who haven't received training) can use the defibrillator in the telephone kiosk.

The answer is simple - 'YES'.

In an emergency you need to call 999. If it's appropriate the operator will be able to tell you where the nearest defibrillator is located and talk you through how to use it.

SOLAR FARM UPDATE JANUARY 2022

Sorry this news is arriving later than planned.

All the solar panels are now in and the contractors are wiring them up.

The control equipment is now being delivered to the site to connect to the panels and the internal roadways are starting to be finished together with the planting under the panels.

In previous reports I anticipated that all the HGV movements would have been completed by the end of January allowing Witpit Lane to reopen. As you may be aware the formal road closure has now been extended to 31 May 2022. Gridserve now advise that it is unlikely that the HGV movements will be completed before the end of March 2022 so it is unlikely that Witpit Lane will reopen before the middle of April 2022.

In addition there are some reinstatement works to be carried out to the whole length of Witpit Lane and these will need to be carried out in advance of the reopening.

ROADWORKS

Burford Road (waiting for update) - between A417 dual carriageway and the traffic lights at the junction with Cherry Tree Lane. The Eastbound section of the road is closed for about three months to enable the construction of a dedicated left turn lane to Northleach (Fosseway). It is possible to travel up Cherry Tree Lane to the traffic lights and turn right to Burford, turn left for A417 dual carriageway and straight on for Northleach. It is not possible to go from the A417 towards the traffic lights.

UPDATE: The Burford Road closure looks as though it may be extended to 31 January 2022.

In the last few months I have needed regular visits for treatment from the medical world. I discovered that there is a **MINOR INJURIES UNIT** in Circnester Hospital, of which I was COMPLETELY unaware. It proved to be an excellent service and, in case others in Preston are not aware of this service, here is how it works.

If you have a problem that might be described as a 'minor' medical issue, the service is available on 0300 421 7777 (Call centre)

The team takes information from you in order to 'triage' your issue. If it is considered to be something that the local MIU can handle, an appointment is made to suit you. So there is no need to be in a queue for assistance! But you can also go straight there and queue!
