SOLAR FARM UPDATE MAY 2022

Just a short report this month to bring the contract to a close.

All the Civil Engineering and Electrical Contractors will have finished their work by Friday 10 June following which the CCTV (for their site security) will be installed, the landscaping carried out and the whole site commissioned.

Gridserve anticipate that all the works should be finished by Friday 8 July when they will begin exporting electricity to the National Grid.

Following the completion of the works the operations and maintenance teams will take over the site so there will still be a small presence, possibly sporadic.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Here is a very important reminder from last month -

Please think about the security of your home. Keep doors and windows locked if out in the garden.

There have been a number of reports of sheds being broken into around Cirencester. Make sure your sheds and outbuildings are securely locked; alarms are also available.

With increased fuel prices please be aware that heating oil thefts will likely increase, make sure that your oil tanks are secure and well-lit to deter thieves.

With the news of dog theft so close to Preston, remember to remain aware while walking your dogs. Vary your routes and think about carrying a self-defence spray. (*Editor's comment Search* Dog 'DNA Protect' for protection for dogs.)

It is possible to report phishing emails by forwarding the message to 7726 (it spells spam) and then sending them the details of where the message came from. Waste collection days unchanged for Queen's Platinum Jubilee

The two-day bank holiday, given in celebration of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, will not affect when residents can expect their waste and recycling collections to take place, so please continue to put containers out as normal.

Improvements made around Cotswold Water Park to support walking & cycling

Working with Cotswold Lakes Trust, CDC has made improvements around Cotswold Water Park that will make it easier for people to walk and cycle around the area including new cycle parking, new cycle paths, new waymarked walking routes and signage for visitors.

Council Tax rebate update

CDC has been distributing the Government's £150 council tax rebate for households in council tax bands A-D to help with increased energy costs and working as fast as possible to distribute the money. So far over 18,700 payments have been made to residents who pay their council tax by direct debit.

Those who don't pay by direct debit will be contacted by letter with information on how to apply and provide the information needed to make the payment. If you are eligible, please look out for the letter and respond as soon as possible.

For those not eligible for the original rebate, CDC has set up a scheme to help those who will need it most. You can check if you are eligible and apply on CDC's website. https://cotswold.gov.uk/150rebate
