Last month we had the great privilege and joy of welcoming Ann Edwards Church of England Primary School into All Hallows Church for their Harvest Festival Service. It was a lovely service as we gathered together to celebrated Harvest with poems, songs and prayers lead so beautifully by the children. One of the songs sung was Autumn Days, a favourite for school harvest festivals and one that I am sure will be familiar to many of you, a reminder of yours or your families' school days. It is a song written in the 1960s that reflects on the season of autumn mentioning things to be thankful for at this time of year like the taste of apples pies, the jewelled grass, the winters moon and the rainbow in whipped up spray. All rounded up in the catchy chorus, "So I mustn't forget. No, I mustn't forget. To say a great big thank you. I mustn't forget." It is a song that reminds us of one of the central themes of harvest that of thankfulness as the church takes a moment to be thankful to God for his goodness, generosity and love.

Taking a moment to be thankful can really make a difference to our day.

With the continuing increase in fuel prices please be aware that heating oil thefts will likely increase, make sure that your oil tanks are secure and well-lit to deter thieves.

Remember to remain aware while walking your dogs. Vary your routes and think about carrying a self-defence spray. (Search Dog 'DNA Protect' for protection for dogs.) It is possible to report phishing texts by forwarding the message to 7726 (it spells spam) and then sending them the details of where the message came from. You can, of course, also block the number so it doesn't call you again!
