Disproportionate burden

The Preston Parish Website is hosted and developed by the Parish Clerk at minimal cost to the Parish. This is a cost effective solution enabling the Parish meet its statutory obligations whilst operating within a small and finite annual budget. A clear restriction arising from this approach is that there is limited scope to adjust webpage template parameters which are largely based on CSS Framework themes.

The cost of moving the Parish website to a fully WCAG 2.1 compliant web platform would likely consume a large proportion of the Parish Council's annual budget and incur and annual recurring maintenance together with audit cost liability thereafter. It is the Parish Councils considered opinion that, whilst full WCAG 2.1 compliance remains a clear aspiration, the current costs involved would represent a disproportionate burden within the meaning of the accessibility regulations.

Content that's not within the scope of the accessibility regulations

The accessibility regulations do not require us to fix PDFs or other documents published before 23 September 2018 if they're not essential to providing our services.

Preparation of this accessibility statement
